Despite challenging market conditions, Arcelor Mittal Tubular Products Karviná remains active in investment in production. The installation of a packaging line completed the modernization of rolling line No. 10, which will be further expanded with automatic strapping. Rolling line No. 7 has been equipped with rolling stands, enhancing the quality of tube and profile production. The new stands will cover the entire portfolio of individual manufactured profiles and introduce production of higher quality. Other planned investments include a new compressor, the reconstruction of a substation, and projects for workplace safety.



Automation of storage solves bundle localization issues

The production team at ArcelorMittal Tubular Products Karviná collaborates with the Technical University of Ostrava on a new project for the automation of storage. The project addresses issues with localizing bundles of steel profiles in warehouses. The new solution will use the 3D position of the crane hook to identify and move bundles. The load detection system will simplify the handling process and increase warehouse efficiency.



Successfully defended certifications confirm long-term high quality

ArcelorMittal Tubular Products Karviná successfully underwent several external audits confirming the high quality of the management system and products. Audits covered areas such as quality, environment, and occupational safety. The company managed to defend the certificate for supplying pressure pipes to the Polish construction market from ZENOM and the KIWA certificate for deliveries to the Dutch market. The TZUS audit for products supplied to the EU construction industry and the TUV Nord audit for pipes intended for pressure equipment in the EU were also successful.



Karviná prepares for new challenges – expansion into the British market and maritime industry

ArcelorMittal in Karviná actively responds to new market requirements and prepares for expansion into new markets. It is gearing up for the transition of EU certificates to the British market and aims to undergo DNV certification for materials intended for shipbuilding.
